## **COVID-19 Pandemic: The Center's Response**

#### CCSSE 2020 Administration

Due to the pandemic, all 247 CCSSE 2020 member colleges transitioned their instruction to the online environment during the spring term. While 9% (23) of those colleges were able to complete the paper-and-pencil, in-class survey administration before they moved online, 85% (209 colleges) opted to postpone their administration completely. Six percent (14 colleges) opted to administer a free limited online version of the survey that was made available to allow colleges to collect engagement data during the pandemic. One college was forced to withdraw due to their surveys getting lost during return shipment.

#### COVID-19 Early Impact Survey: Spring 2020

The Center developed a stand-alone online survey to measure the early impacts of COVID-19 on the student experience. Twenty-five colleges across 10 states administered this survey to nearly 13,000 student respondents between April 29 and June 9. Below are some of the results:

- » 88% of respondents agreed that their college had been supportive of them during the pandemic.
- » 76% of respondents were concerned about finding a job after completing their educational goals.
- » 36% of Black or African American students said accessing a reliable computer or laptop was a challenge, compared with 24% of Hispanic or Latinx students and 14% of White students.

#### COVID-19 Impact Special-Focus Items: SENSE 2020 & CCSSE 2021 Administrations

Through the support of the Trellis Foundation, the *SENSE* 2020 administration includes <u>12 special-focus items</u> and *CCSSE* 2021 will include <u>five special-focus items</u> to solicit information about the COVID-19 impact on the student experience. An executive summary highlighting those results will be released following each survey administration.

#### Future Online Survey Administrations

As a result of the pandemic, the Center is intent on offering future survey administrations online to colleges that need this option. Response rate remains a major concern. This will be a discussion item for the National Advisory Board.

### We Stand Committed

In response to the recent displays of horrific injustice, the Center created a <u>We Stand Committed</u> webpage that includes the excerpt below as well as <u>video clips</u> from a <u>2014 special report</u> featuring students and faculty discussing aspirations to achievement for men of color in community colleges.

We remain committed to sharing insights around the student voice, including the voices of students who have been historically underserved and underrepresented in higher education. We are also committed to supporting community colleges across the country as they continue the vital work of providing opportunity for every student who walks through their doors.

#### Special Advisory Committee: Race and Ethnicity

In the long term, the Center will focus on validating this new survey.
