


Center Releases Three National Publications This Fall



- » Released September 15
- » Funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation
- » Provides first national look at whether students experience key elements of quided pathways reforms

Equity Tools Spotlight



An essential condition of the guided pathways model is a commitment to equity in student outcomes. Thus, as part of developing the playbook and accompanying toolkit highlighted above, the Center partnered with the Office of Community College Research and Leadership (OCCRL) to offer equity-minded practices that college professionals can employ to ensure all students are learning. This specific Equity Tools section of the online toolkit includes issue briefs that cover topics such as creating an equity-minded syllabus and the role of midlevel leaders in advancing equity. A fifth brief (pictured at left) contains supplemental exercises and resources to be used with the four primary briefs. Four abbreviated spotlight briefs that can be used independently or as complements to the issue briefs are also available.

The Center hosted a <u>webinar on November 11</u> with Dr. Eboni Zamani-Gallaher, OCCRL Director, to discuss these tools.

Spring 2021: Race/Ethnicity Pilot Survey

As part of the Center's <u>commitment</u> announced this summer, the Center and a <u>special advisory committee</u> (including our board's very own Dr. Michael A. Baston, President of Rockland Community College) finalized a standalone <u>survey</u> that will be piloted by *CCSSE* 2021 colleges between April 15 and June 15, 2021. The purpose of this pilot survey is to help colleges understand their students' experiences with racism, inclusion, and belonging. It is the Center's hope that college leaders will use the data to have conversations with faculty and staff about how racial barriers and experiences impact community college students and the campus climate.

College leaders will receive reporting disaggregated by race and ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, and age. Additionally, a small set of <u>related items</u> can be added to the 2021 administration of the Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (*CCFSSE*) free of charge. The Center also published some <u>FAQs</u>.
